

As we come into Autumn, we'd like to thank everyone for their patience with us during the summer months whilst we faced some staffing challenges.

However, this did highlight to us the importance of patients helping themselves by going to the most appropriate service for their need.

If you have a medical emergency, you should call 999 or visit A&E.

If you need urgent dental help and cannot find a dentist, you should call 0300 123 1663 (Mon – Fri 8am – 4pm)


For minor issues, you may be able to treat these at home.

As a reminder, most pharmacies can also help. As well as advising on medical for minor issues, they can treat seven common conditions. There are age restrictions on which patients pharmacists can treat.

Flu Vaccinations

Get your free NHS flu jab if you're eligible

Do all you can to keep yourself well during winter.



Most pharmacies can help you with **seven common conditions** without needing a GP appointment

Speak to your pharmacist if you suspect you have:

- Sinusitis
- Sore throat
- Earache (children)
- Infected insect bite
- Impetigo
- Shingles
- Urinary tract infection (women)



Visit your Pharmacy First!

We are also shortly coming into Flu Season. Based on feedback from last year's clinics, we have decided to go back to having Saturday clinics for Flu Vaccinations. We will be running clinics on the following days:

- Saturday 4th October at Yapton Surgery
- Saturday 11th October at Middleton Surgery

If you are eligible for your vaccination, you will be invited to book an appointment. The invite will contain a self-booking link for you to book your own appointment. Please use this if you are able to as it frees up our phone lines for those patients who can't.

If you cannot make these dates, then most pharmacies are offering flu vaccinations.

The Avisford Medical Group Website (www.avisford.co.uk) directs patients to our Online Consultation service called Accurx Triage. If you have an admin request, you can submit this at any time during the day without having to telephone the surgery. We aim to reply within 72 hours.

Patient Feedback and GP Survey

Each month, we review feedback left by patients. We use this feedback to understand what our patients are experiencing, and try and make improvements where possible. You are able to share your feedback by completing a Friends and Family Test form in the surgery, or visiting www.iwantgreatcare.org and leaving your feedback there. We will also invite patients to leave feedback after appointments at the surgery by sending them a link to iWantGreatCare.

Displays in our waiting room are updated quarterly with data, feedback and what we are doing with the feedback. Please check this out next time you visit.


Overall rating 5 for this quarter

Recently, a National GP Patient Survey was completed. 271 surveys were sent out, and of those that responded, 77% of patients had a good experience at our GP Practice.

Developments in the NHS

As the Patient Participation Group (PPG) for the practice, the Friends are heavily involved in the work of West Sussex PPG Forum. The Forum's primary objective is to make PPGs more effective (several practices do not have properly functioning PPGs), through advice on how to run a PPG; share information about what works well, especially around improving patient engagement; giving feedback on proposals for local services and other ICB (Integrated Care Board) plans.

The Friends also play an active part in the Regis Community Health Board. The Board comprises health professionals, practice managers and PPG members from the four practices (Avisford, Arundel, Flansham and Bersted). We learn about local health initiatives and services, share information about service delivery and the concerns of our patients.

There is one issue that all PPGs are determined to see in place and that is a complete directory of services available to patients and how to access them. This would benefit practices as they would not have to do the signposting they do now, and patients would be able to access the services they need more quickly.

The NHS 10-year plan

There has been much in the news recently about the NHS 10-year plan. The background is that an independent review by Lord Darzi found that there were not enough GP appointments, waiting lists were too long, outcomes for major diseases were poor and staff were demoralised. So the key actions in the plan are:

- To move care from hospitals into the community – a neighbourhood health service
- Increase the use of technology, including AI. The key development is the NHS App which by 2028 will give patients access to most of their medical history and to services.
- Place a greater emphasis on prevention of illness with the focus on not only healthier lifestyles but more equal provision of healthcare.

The neighbourhood health model is being piloted in Community Treatment Centres.

The NHS App has been launched but a particular concern is that a significant part of the population does not have access to technology. However, the Government has assured us that alternative means of access will be available. Age UK among other charities are offering help to make the most of the NHS App and we may put on an event offering similar help.

Other actions in support of the plan include the extension of the Sussex Integrated Care Board (ICB) to include Surrey Heartlands; a dramatic reduction in the budget of ICBs and some work will move back the Department of Health and Social Care or the Local Authority. Also related to this is the abolition of all Healthwatch groups across the country. As for the rest - time will tell!
